The brilliant solemnity of the events that we are celebrating takes precedence over such external manifestations of penitence. For our Lord’s death and resurrection “blotted out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us ... nailing it to His cross; and having spoiled principalities and powers, He made a show of them openly, triumphing over them in it.” (Col. 2:14,15) Accordingly, “here is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus ...” (Rom. 8:1) We resume kneeling at appropriate times during the “

**The Feast of Pentecost is traditionally considered the birth of what is today known as the Christian Church.**

The Descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles assembled in the upper room and their subsequent address to those who had gathered outside begins the international and intercultural spread of Christianity. The Holy Spirit comes to bring new life to all. In hierarchy of celebration, Pentecost ranks just below Pascha—the Feast of Feasts. It is locked into its position—fifty days after the Resurrection and ten days after Christ’s Ascension to the Father in Heaven. It is a MOVEABLE FEAST—that is, it does not depend on a specific calendar date like the Nativity but is solely determined by the date of Pascha.

**5 June 2022 THE HOLY AND GLORIOUS FEAST OF PENTECOST**

**EPISTLE - ACTS 2: 1 - 11 ~ GOSPEL - JOHN 7: 37 - 52; 8: 12**

**STONE FOR THE FEAST**

This is a day of great joy, the birthday of the Church. All that Christ imparted to us through His saving incarnation, defeat of sin and death, and glorious ascension, has its fulfillment this day: We’re here today worshipping God the Holy Trinity, one in essence and undivided, for this is also known as the day the Holy Trinity was first preached. We’re here today because of the promise of love made by Christ God Himself, saying, “*You shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit*” (Acts 1:5). The Feast commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles on the day of Pentecost, a feast of the Jewish tradition. It also celebrates the establishment of the Church through the preaching of the Apostles and the baptism of the thousands who on that day believed in the Gospel message of salvation through Jesus Christ. The Feast is also seen as the culmination of the revelation of the Holy Trinity. The word Pentecost means “the fiftieth” and is used to designate the great event of the Outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Epiphotesis) upon the Apostles and the Church on the 50th day after the Resurrection of Christ, just ten days after His Ascension into Heaven. Before His Passion, the Lord spoke to his Disciples about the gift of the Holy Spirit, which they were to receive after the Ascension. The details are preserved in the Gospel of Saint John: “*I will ask the Father to send you the Holy Spirit who will defend you and always be with you*” (14:16). He also said, “*The Holy Spirit cannot come to defend you until I leave. But after I am gone, I will send the Spirit to you*” (16:7). After His Resurrection, the Lord appeared to the Disciples, and He said to them, “*Receive the Holy Spirit*” (20:22). This was a foretaste of the Outpouring (Epiphotesis) on Pentecost Sunday. Near the end of Saint Luke’s Gospel, Christ tells His Disciples, “*I will send you the One My Father has promised, but you must stay in the city until you are given power from above*” (24:49). It is in the Acts of the Apostles, however, that Saint Luke speaks of the fulfillment of this promise: “*On the day of Pentecost, all the Lord’s followers were together in one place. Suddenly, there was a noise from heaven like the sound of a mighty wind. It filled the house where they were meeting. Then they saw what looked like fiery tongues moving in all directions, and a tongue came and settled on each person there. The Holy Spirit took control of everyone, and they began speaking whatever language the Spirit let them speak*” (2:1-4). Since ancient times, the 50-day period from Pascha to Pentecost has been called Pentecost because what began with the Lord breathing the Holy Spirit on His Disciples was consummated with the full descent of the Spirit upon the Disciples and the whole Church. Thus, the Church was fully born and began to grow. During this period, all fasting and kneeling is prohibited as a tangible confession of the Resurrection of Christ. It is only on the actual day of Pentecost that kneeling is resumed, and is connected with a special kneeling ceremony (akolouthia gonyklesias), which consists of prayers for the gift of the Holy Spirit, hence the name, “*Kneeling Day*” (tes gonatistes) for Pentecost.

Later on, another week was added to these 50 days in order to celebrate the post-feast (metheorta) of the Feast of Pentecost. Thus, today the period of movable Feasts after Pascha spans eight weeks, to include the Sunday of All Saints – June 12 - (Agion Panton), and is divided into three parts:

1. The 40 post-festal days of Pascha,
2. The Feast of the Ascension, together with its post-festal period, and
3. The Feast of Pentecost together with its own post-festal period.

The hymns of this period are contained in the special Pentecostal book, the Pentecostarion. (*Excerpt from <https://www.stgeorgeto.org/>*)

**PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT:** Heavenly King, Comforter, Spirit of Truth

You are everywhere present and fill all things. Treasury of blessings and Giver of Life, Come and dwell within in us, Cleanse us of all stain, And save our souls O Gracious

**PRAYER TO THE BLESSED TRINITY:** O Most Holy Trinity, have mercy on us; O Lord, cleanse us of our sins; O Master forgive our transgressions; O Holy One, come to us and heal our infirmities for your Names's sake. Tradition is that in the evening of Pentecost, Vespers are celebrated with the "Kneeling Prayers." Many parishes now celebrate the "Kneeling Prayers" immediately following the Divine Liturgy of the day. Also, there are no fasting requirements this week -

~~Kneeling Prayers of Pentecost~~

**Sunday of Pentecost** is one of the most important days of the year in the Church. The highlight of Pentecost services are the Kneeling Prayers, usually done at the end of the Pentecost Liturgy. During the 50 days after Easter we do not kneel, and we wait to kneel for the first time at these Kneeling Prayers on Pentecost Sunday. They are profound and can teach us how to pray to God the Holy Trinity. The prayers show us that our lives are indeed lived under the gaze and grace of the Holy Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Three prayers are offered by the priest during this prayer - here in shortened version is the Second Prayer: **The Second Prayer:** Lord Jesus, you gave your peace to us, and you are always present to us, giving us the gift of the Holy Spirit. You sent down this grace in a manner most clear upon your holy disciples and apostles, and opened their lips with tongues of fire. Through them and others, the nations of the world have received the knowledge of God and have heard the message, each in their own language. We have been enlightened by the light of the Spirit, and we have been freed from delusion and darkness. Through the distribution of tongues of fire, we have been taught to worship one God in Trinity. You, O Christ, are the radiance of the Father and the exact image of his nature; you are the fountain of wisdom and grace. Open our lips and teach us how to pray. Order our lives and make known to each of us the way in which we should walk. May the Spirit of wisdom cover all my reasoning, and may my foolishness be overcome by the Spirit of understanding. Overshadow my deeds with the Spirit of reverence and the fear of God, and renew a right spirit within me. Establish my faltering mind with your guiding Spirit so that I may be guided every day by your good Spirit toward what is useful, to keep your commandments, and always to remember your fearful and glorious second coming. You, Master, promised us that whatever we ask in your name shall be freely given to us by your Father, the eternal God. Therefore, we supplicate your goodness, that you guard us in your salvation, for you sinlessly became the merciful partaker of our nature, to become atonement for our sins. Sanctify us now by your saving power. Against you, you only, do we sin; but you alone we also adore. We know not how to worship a strange god, nor how to stretch our hands to any other god, O Master. May our prayer rise as incense in your blessed Kingdom.
