





# The hope of a tree The Most Holy Cross

"For there is a hope of a tree, if it be cut down, that it will be green again; and that the tender branches thereof will sprout forth." Job (14:7-10) Thus in Holy Scripture by the name of 'tree' we have represented sometimes the Cross, sometimes the righteous man, or even the unrighteous man, and sometimes the Wisdom of God Incarnate.


Thus the Cross is denoted by 'the tree,' when it is said, Let us put the tree into his bread [Jer. 11, 19, V.]; for to 'put the tree into the bread' is to apply the Cross to the Body of our Lord. Again by the title of 'the tree' we have the just man, or even the unjust man, set forth, as the Lord saith by the Prophet, I the Lord have brought down the high

tree, and exalted the low tree. [Ez. 17, 24] Forasmuch as according to the word of the self-same Truth, Whosoever exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted [Luke 14, 11]...The Wisdom of God Incarnate is represented by 'the Tree,' as where it is written thereon, She is a tree of life to them that lay hold on Her. [Prov. 3, 18] And as She Herself says, If they do these things in a green tree, what shall be done in the dry? [Luke 23, 31]

For there is a hope of a tree, if it be cut down, that it will be green again. For when in a death of painful endurance the just man is hard bestead for the truth, in the greenness of everlasting life he is recovered again; and he who here proved green by faith, there becomes green in actual sight [speciem]. 'And his branches shoot,' in that it is most often the case that by the sufferings of the just man, all faithful persons are redoubled in the love of the heavenly country, and they receive the greenness of the spiritual life, while they are glad that he did courageously here in God's behalf.

#### FIRST SUNDAY OF THE GREAT FAST / LENT ~ SUNDAY OF ORTHODOXY

EPISTLE - HEBREWS 11: 24 - 26, 32-40, 12: 1 - 2 GOSPEL - JOHN 1: 43 - 51 TONE 5



"Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation (II Cor. 6)." We are now in a time of preparation for Pascha, when the love of God destroyed the ultimate power of sin and death. The Church calls us to increased prayer and fasting, to increased almsgiving, to self-examination and confession. We are called to prepare our hearts and souls and return to God. On this first Sunday of Lent, the Church celebrates the Triumph of Orthodoxy, (Orthodoxy literally means right praise, right glory, right worship) the triumph of the Orthodox faith over heresy. It was on this day in the year 842 that the Empress Theodora and St. Methodius of Constantinople restored the icons to the churches, overcoming the heresy of iconoclasm. Refuting those who said that it was wrong to make a material image of God or of the saints. and even more wrong to venerate that object, the Church teaches us that God has made an icon of Himself in Jesus Christ. St. Paul tells us that Christ is the perfect image — the icon — of the Father. When we make and venerate an icon, we are not worshiping a board with a picture painted upon it, our worship is reserved for God alone - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. When we venerate an icon, we are showing our love, our respect, our desire to follow what the icon shows us. When we kiss an icon of Christ, in our hearts, we are kissing Christ Himself. Our Lord Jesus Christ established His Church, called it into being, gave it direction and order, for the purpose of bringing the world back to God. We are made in the image and likeness of God, but this

gift was tarnished and wounded by the disobedience of man, by man turning away from God. Instead of living as icons of God, we sought to serve ourselves, and so death entered the world. It is in the Church, which is the mystical body of Christ on earth, that we find purification and healing, that we find the road which leads us back to God. We also know the Church as the Bride of Christ, as in the relationship between Christ and His Church we find the true meaning of love, as Christ gives His life, We must seek to worship God as He is, and not as we would like Him to be. We are to come together, with open and loving hearts, to praise and adore our God, to give thanks for all we have received, to confess how we have missed the mark of living as an icon of God, to ask for those things that are needed for life, and to be fed with Word and Sacrament. Our worship is to be corporate, for we are members of the body. We are to be both reverent and joyful, and our worship is to be as the Church guides us, thus avoiding emotionalism or "trendiness"—two problems which usually focus the attention on the worshiper instead of focusing the worshipers heart and mind on God. As we enter this holy season of the Great Fast/Lent, let us heed the words

of St. Paul in our Epistle today, "Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation." With all the help God offers to us through the Church, may we strive to restore the image of God within us. As God is loving, we are to be loving. As God is forgiving, so we are to be forgiving. As God is merciful and generous, so we are to be merciful and generous. As God is pure and holy, so we are to be pure and holy. These and all other good things are truly offered to us — and we may receive them to the degree we give ourselves to God. May we pray for the grace to give ourselves completely to God. Our Lord Jesus Christ is the perfect icon, the perfect image of the Father. Even as the saints have been icons of God, although imperfect, in their time and place — so we too are called to be icons of God, here and now, at home, at work, at school. Now, as we prepare for Pascha, let us prepare by right faith, right worship, and right living, giving thanks for God's many blessings, that we may share in His holy and resurrected life. CATECHISM - CHRIST OUR PASCHA - TODAY'S EPISTLE / GOSPEL LESSON :

**ICONS**: Page 52, Section 132; Page 119, Sections 331-334; Page 196, Sections 589—599; Page 214, Sections 65-658

Although our Church traditionally prescribed abstention from meat and dairy products in days gone by for the entire duration of the Great Fast, the following are the minimal Lenten regulations today:

- Abstinence from meat and all dairy products on the First Day of the Great Fast and on Good Friday.
- ♦ Abstinence from meat only on all Fridays of the Great Fast as well as Holy Saturday.
- ♦ It is also traditional to abstain from meat on Wednesdays during the Great Fast.
- ♦ All the faithful are urged to attend the Lenten services such as the Presanctified Liturgy and the Commemoration of the Deceased (Sorokousty).

Such good deeds as almsgiving, visitation of the sick, Bible reading and praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life are most earnestly recommended to all the Faithful Departed

# Great Lent or The Great Fast

- In the Byzantine Catholic Tradition or Greek Catholic tradition, Great Lent or the Great Fast begins seven weeks prior to Pascha (Easter) on Clean Monday also known as Pure Monday. Lent is preceded by the services of the Triodion. Byzantines Catholics or Greek Catholics unlike Roman Catholics do not observe Ash Wednesday. The Great Fast or Great Lent lasts 40 days, unlike the Roman Catholic season of Lent, the Byzantine Great fast includes Sundays.
- The Great Fast comes to an end on Friday of the sixth week, before Lazarus Saturday, which is the Saturday before Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday the Great entrance of our Lord into Jerusalem is celebrated, this is one of the major feasts of the Byzantine liturgical year. Palm Sunday is followed by the first three days of Holy week known in the Greek Catholic tradition as "the end".
- These days are Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday, and Holy Wednesday, during these days the Bridegroom services are celebrated. Holy Monday begins with the Orthros (matins) on Palm Sunday evening (the beginning of the liturgical day) and the celebration of bride groom services. These services portray Jesus as the bridegroom who give his life for his bride, the last bridegroom service culminate on Holy Wednesday evening. During holy week the services are reversed, the orthros (matins) is celebrated in the evening and Vespers are celebrated in the morning.
- Each day during Holy Week has a theme. The theme for Monday is Joseph's virtue, and the withering of the fig tree; Tuesday is the Ten Virgins; Wednesday is the anointing of Jesus at Bethany, Thursday is the Mystical Supper, Great Friday is the Passion, and Holy Saturday also known as the Great Sabbath is the burial of our Lord. On Holy Wednesday the sacrament of anointing (Holy Unction) takes place, healing is intimately connected with repentance in Byzantine spirituality.

#### PRAYER FOR THE DELIVERANCE OF UKRAINE IN TIME OF INVASION

Adapted from the Great Book of Needs

After the Augmented Litany the Holy Doors are opened and the deacon (or priest) exclaims:

Deacon: Let us attend, and with compunctionate hearts having inclined the knees of our souls and bodies, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord have mercy. (thrice)

And the priest (on bended knees) says this prayer in a loud voice with compunction:

Lord God of powers, and God of our salvation, O God, who alone work wonders: look down with mercy and compassion on Your humble servants, and out of love for mankind hearken and have mercy on us and on the land of Ukraine. For, behold, enemies have once more gathered together, in order to cause division and enmity. But You who know all things, understand that they have risen up unrighteously, and that it will be impossible to oppose their multitudes unless You show us Your help. Therefore, we who are sinful and unworthy pray unto You in repentance and with tears: Help us, O God, our Saviour, and deliver the land of Ukraine for the sake of the glory of Your Name, that the enemy may not to say: "Their God has forsaken them, and there is none to deliver and save them." But let every nation understand that You are our God, and we Your people are always protected under Your dominion.

Reveal Your mercy, O Lord, and let the words spoken by Moses unto the people of Israel be applied to us: "Fear not. Stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord. For the Lord shall fight for us." [Gen. 14:13,14] Work for us a sign for good, that they who are filled with hatred may see our orthodox faith and be humbled and shaken. Yes, O Lord God, our Saviour, our Strength and Hope and Help, remember not the transgressions and unrighteousness of Your faithful people, and turn not away from us in Your anger. But visit Your mercies and compassions upon Your humble servants, those who fight in defence of Ukraine and her much-suffering people, outnumbered though they be, and hear us who fall down before Your deep compassion. With Your mercy enlighten and make glad the hearts of the civil authorities, and strengthened them by Your might.

Rise up to their help and lay low the evil councils purposed against them by the enemy. Judge them that provoke and make war, and turn their impious boldness into fear and flight. But grant unto the just and God-fearing armies of the children of Ukraine, great boldness and courage to advance and overtake them, and to defeat them in Your Name. And unto them that You have judged to lay down their lives for faith and country, forgive them their trespasses, and in the day of the righteous reckoning grant unto them incorruptible crowns.

For You are the health and victory and salvation of them that put their hope in You, and unto You do we send up glory: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.
