


Monthly Meeting of St Peter & St Paul Board of Directors

On Sunday, May 21st, at 2 p.m. the Yevshan Ukrainian Vocal Ensemble will be presenting a concert of Ukrainian sacred and secular music at the Knights of Columbus Museum, Blessed Michael McGivney Pilgrimage Center at 1 State Street in New Haven, CT, just north of the Union Railroad Station. This concert will coincide with a beautiful exhibit of authentic Ukrainian Rushnyky - woven tapestries and textiles. All parishioners are encouraged to attend. A house without a rushnyk is not a home." — Ukrainian proverb The word rushnyk derives from ruka, "hand," and while it can refer to an ordinary towel, the ceremonial rushnyk is distinct in its ornamentation and its importance. In almost any Ukrainian home, the family icons—and, more recently, family photographs—would be draped with rushnyky. They are believed to offer protection to family, home and village. The cloths appear in all family rituals, infants are wrapped in them at birth and they play a significant role in betrothal and wedding ceremonies. Remarkably, even after the turmoil of the twentieth and twenty first centuries the use of rushnyky is still an integral part of Ukrainian culture.

NO KNEELING – We should not kneel or make prostrations in Church or in our private prayers at home from Pascha through Pentecost (this year, May 28). Kneeling and prostrating are postures of repentance and sorrow for our sins. The brilliant solemnity of the events that we are celebrating takes precedence over such external manifestations of penitence. For our Lord's death and resurrection "blotted out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us ... nailing it to His cross; and having spoiled principalities and powers, He made a show of them openly, triumphing over them in it." (Col. 2:14,15) Accordingly, "here is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus ..." (Rom. 8:1) We resume kneeling at appropriate times during the "Kneeling Vespers" celebrated after the Divine Liturgy for Holy Pentecost


ANTIPASCHA - *St. Thomas Sunday* The Sunday after Easter, called the Second Sunday, is thus the eighth day of the paschal celebration, the last day of Bright Week. It is therefore called the Antipascha, and it was only on this day in the early church that the newly-baptized Christians removed their robes and entered once again into the life of this world. The services stress the Apostle Thomas' vision of Christ.

EPISTLE - ACTS 5: 12 - 20 GOSPEL - JOHN 20: 19 - 31 TONE OF THE FEAST CHRIST IS RISEN! TRULY HE IS RISEN!

DO NOT BE FAITHLESS BUT BELIEVING!

St. Cyril of Alexandria says:



"When Christ greeted his holy disciples with the words "peace be with you," by peace he meant himself, for Christ's presence always brings tranquility of soul. ... The peace of Christ which passes all understanding is in fact the Spirit of Christ, who fills those who share in him with every blessing."

At the beginning of this Gospel reading, we learn that the disciples were gathered together, hidden away, because they were afraid of the Jews. It seemed that something had happened to their Lord Jesus, there had been angels and an empty tomb, but nothing yet made sense and they were still afraid. Everything changed for them when he suddenly appeared among them. The door was shut fast. They didn't want anyone finding them. But their Lord Jesus was suddenly there all the same. What were the first words that he spoke to them after his resurrection? They were words of comfort and encouragement. Peace be with you, he said. And it was his presence which filled them with joy and gave them that peace they had been lacking. It wasn't enough to know that Jesus might be risen from the dead, they needed him to be with them, so that their fears disappeared in his presence.

This message of peace was so important that the Lord Jesus repeated it again. Peace be with you. In the presence of our Lord Jesus there is peace. And after we have prayed the prayers of consecration and the divine action of the Holy Spirit transforms bread and wine into the Body and Blood of our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ, there are several times when the Priest intones, Peace be with you.

But he does not only give us his peace. He sends us out in service. Indeed, the purpose of the Christian life, of growing into union with God by the indwelling Holy Spirit, is so that we can serve the will and the purpose of God in the world and make Christ present among those who need his healing presence themselves. We are not gathered here today simply for ourselves, but so that having received the grace of God, the gift of the life and love in the Holy Spirit, we might go out and share it.

says to the Apostles, "As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." He sends us out in the same saving mission to the world which brought about the incarnation. Just as he became man for the sake of the world, so he now sends us out with his peace to bring peace and comfort and strength to those who need healing. But it was not only in his peace that he sent out his disciples, it was with the power of the Holy Spirit. And just as God had breathed the Holy Spirit into Adam as his true life, so this divine life, which was lost when Adam sinned, is renewed in those who are united to Christ.

In the peace of Christ,

and in the power of the Holy Spirit, all that we receive from God in the Liturgy and in the spiritual life of communion with God in prayer, is to be given away as we are sent out into the world. We gather together here, and are filled with heavenly bread, and we are sent out again, to share what we have received. Thomas is the mystic of the Eighth Day – for the day on which he encountered the Risen Lord was eight days after the Resurrection. St. Thomas waited 8 days. Perhaps the other disciples also started to wonder if they had imagined things? Or perhaps they encouraged Thomas to be patient and the Lord would come to them again. The 8th day always has a symbolic meaning of being the age of eternity, and on this 8th day after the Resurrection of the Lord we are invited to gather together also and receive the visitation of our Savior. Once again Christ offers peace to those who wait to meet Him, and He is most careful to overcome all of St. Thomas' doubts and fears.

Do you come here today with such fears and anxieties? Do you have such a burden that you cannot even believe that it could ever be taken away? Here in this place Christ will make himself present with us and will give himself to us. In receiving him in Holy Communion he renews in us the divine life of the Holy Spirit and he gives us his peace. Have confidence in the risen Lord Jesus. Turn to him in all your fears. And though the door of your heart may be closed, and you feel that you bear the burden alone, he waits to appear within you, saying, Peace be with you. Call out to the Lord, in this place, and you will find him already here.

Let us attend to this holy celebration of the Liturgy and ask that God will indeed become present among us and take away

our fears, that in His peace and renewed in His life, we might share the divine gift of love with all those He sends us out among. (Excerpts from http://www.stgeorgeministry.com/)
