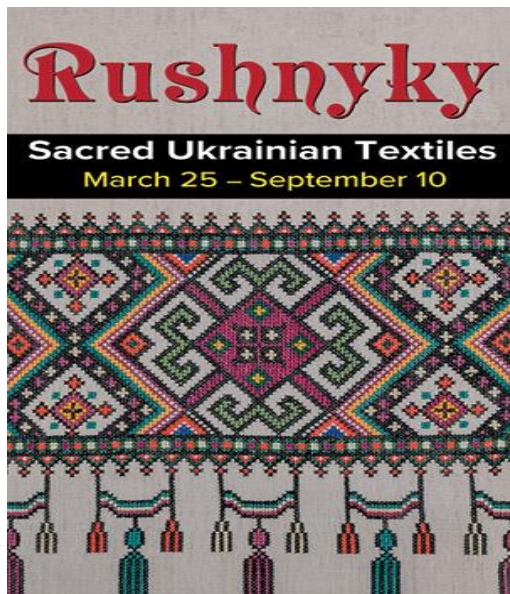

On Sunday, May 21st, at 2 p.m. the Yevshan Ukrainian Vocal Ensemble will be presenting a concert of Ukrainian sacred and secular music at the Knights of Columbus Museum, Blessed Michael McGivney Pilgrimage Center at 1 State Street in New Haven, CT, just north of the Union Railroad Station. This concert will coincide with a beautiful exhibit of authentic Ukrainian Rushnyky - woven tapestries and textiles. All parishioners are encouraged to attend. A house without a rushnyk is not a home." — Ukrainian proverb The word rushnyk derives from ruka, "hand," and while it can refer to an ordinary towel, the ceremonial rushnyk is distinct in its ornamentation and its importance. In almost any Ukrainian home, the family icons—and, more recently, family photographs—would be draped with rushnyky. They are believed to offer protection to family, home and village. The cloths appear in all family rituals, infants are wrapped in them at birth and they play a significant role in betrothal and wedding ceremonies.

Remarkably, even after the turmoil of the twentieth and twenty first centuries the use of rushnyky is still an integral part of Ukrainian culture.

NO KNEELING – We should not kneel or make prostrations in Church or in our private prayers at home from Pascha through Pentecost (this year, May 28). Kneeling and prostrating are postures of repentance and sorrow for our sins. The brilliant solemnity of the events that we are celebrating takes precedence over such external manifestations of penitence. For our Lord's death and resurrection "blotted out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us ... nailing it to His cross; and having spoiled principalities and powers, He made a show of them openly, triumphing over them in it." (Col. 2:14,15) Accordingly, "here is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus ..." (Rom. 8:1) We resume kneeling at appropriate times during the "Kneeling Vespers" celebrated after the Divine Liturgy for Holy Pentecost

SUNDAY OF THE MAN BORN BLIND

EPISTLE - ACTS 16: 16 - 34 **GOSPEL** - JOHN 9: 1 – 38 **TONE** 5

CHRIST IS RISEN! TRULY HE IS RISEN!

"And his disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be made manifest in him."



We have arrived at the last Sunday of the Forty Day celebration of our Lord and Savior's Resurrection. These Forty Days, which come to a close later this week – on the **Feast of the Ascension (Thursday, May 18)** – are the counterweight to the period of Holy and Great Lent. Indeed, we go from a Fast of Forty Days to a Feast of Forty Days! And through these weeks of the Pentecostarion, which take us all the way to Pentecost – the Fiftieth Day after Pascha – we have now arrived at the final Sunday, that of the Man Born Blind. As you know, there are profound teachings in this Gospel Reading. But for us, perhaps, the most profound lesson is that someone who absolutely knew that he

could not see – since he was blind from birth – gained the gift of sight for the first time in his life. And those who said they could see, were instead called blind by the Lord. This contrast is unforgettable. And it speaks to us, especially in our own confusing times, when we see the suffering in our country and around the world. This is the inability to see the truth because you do not want to see it. The Pharisees in the Gospel today could not admit that the Man Born Blind had truly been healed. They found every reason to believe the lie they constructed for themselves, so as to keep themselves in power. However, the honesty that our faith in Jesus Christ calls us to is a hard honesty. It summons us to take responsibility for our actions, and to see with the clarity of truth and not the fog of delusion. This can be distressing, though, even radically so, for our lives, our emotions, our minds and souls, and even our families. But it is the only authentic way to live as a Christian. The Man Born Blind was able to see because he listened to the Word of God. Jesus told him what to do and where to go. He followed his instructions to the letter. He knew he was blind; he at least saw that clearly enough. Jesus' healing of a man blind from birth reminds us of this simple and important truth that only with Jesus Christ, and in Him, can we find a complete and comprehensive answer to all the questions of our lives, to discover their deep spiritual significance for us. It is in the arrogance of the human being that blindness truly exists. And it is in the honesty of the human being that the vision of reality begins to become clear. Thus, may we always choose to follow the path of honesty and to remain faithful to the Lord's commandments – and above all, the commandment to love one another. It is to have the eyes of our souls cleansed, to have our minds illumined such that we move from darkness to light. The change is certainly not in our Lord, but in us who rise with Him from death to life, from the dark night of sin to the brilliant light of holiness. The good news of Pascha is not confined to a season of the year, but is always the fundamental truth of our life in Christ. Now we must live as those who have been blessed to behold the glory of the resurrection. Now we must remove every obstacle to embracing personally the brilliant, radiant light of the empty tomb. Now we must live with all the holy joy of a man born blind who can finally see the light. That is what it means to know God and to be truly human in His image and likeness, for Christ is Risen! 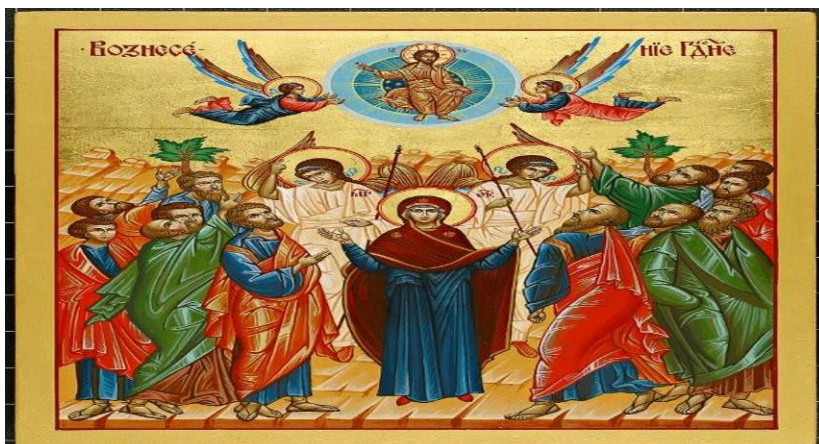

FEAST OF THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD AND SAVIOR JESUS CHRIST




Thursday, May 18, we celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord. The Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord, God and Savior, Jesus Christ, is one of the twelve (12) major holy days that the Eastern Catholic and Orthodox Churches celebrate. Forty (40) days after the celebration of Christ's Resurrection, the Church commemorates the return of Our Lord and Savior to His Heavenly abode, the eternal Kingdom of Heaven. On this Feast of the Holy Ascension of Our Lord, we celebrate the joyous return of the Son of God to the eternal Kingdom of Heaven. Amidst the shouts of victory, the sounds of the trumpets blaring, the Lord returns and ***"sits at the right hand of the Father,"*** and

there He shall be until the Second and Glorious coming of the Lord. And on that day, He shall come again to judge the living and the dead. Our All-loving and Compassionate Lord once again does this on our behalf – to prepare a place for us so that we too may live forever in Heaven.

dark giving her household their food, giving orders to her serving girls. ¹⁶ She sets her mind on a field, then she buys it; with what her hands have earned she plants a vineyard. ¹⁷ She puts her back into her work and shows how strong her arms can be. ¹⁸ She knows that her affairs are going well; her lamp does not go out at night. ¹⁹ She sets her hands to the distaff, her fingers grasp the spindle. ²⁰ She holds out her hands to the poor, she opens her arms to the needy. ²¹ Snow may come, she has no fears for her household, with all her servants warmly clothed. ²² She makes her own quilts, she is dressed in fine linen and purple. ²³ Her husband is respected at the city gates, taking his seat among the elders of the land. ²⁴ She weaves materials and sells them, she supplies the merchant with sashes. ²⁵ She is clothed in strength and dignity, she can laugh at the day to come. ²⁶ When she opens her mouth, she does so wisely; on her tongue is kindly instruction. ²⁷ She keeps good watch on the conduct of her household, no bread of idleness for her. ²⁸ Her children stand up and proclaim her blessed, her husband, too, sings her praises: ²⁹ 'Many women have done admirable things, but you surpass them all!' ³⁰ Charm is deceitful, and beauty empty; the woman who fears Lord is the one to praise. ³¹ Give her a share in what her hands have worked for, and let her works tell her praises at the city gates. 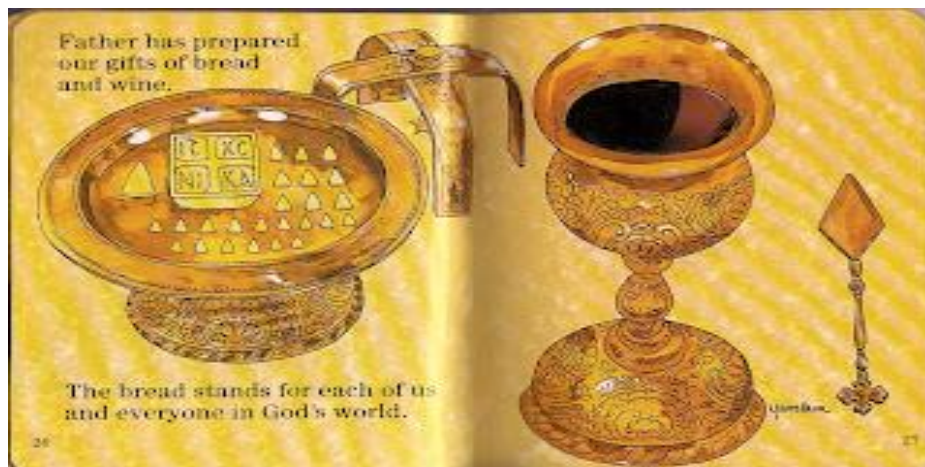

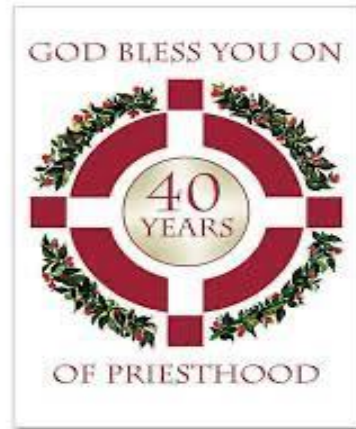
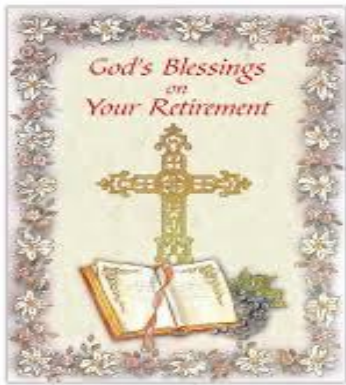
