





The Mind of God ~ Guide us. The Law of God ~ direct us.



EIGHTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST HOLY MARTYRS THROPHIMUS, THEOPHILU AND THOSE WITH THEM EPISTLE - 1 CORINTHIANS 1: 10 - 18 GOSPEL - MATTHEW 14: 14– 22 TONE 7

The Church Fathers interpreted the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand heard in today's reading as an anticipation of Holy Communion in which Christ offers Himself to us as the heavenly bread. In the book of Exodus (16:4-16) of the Old Testament, when the Israelites had escaped from Egypt but then faced terrible hunger in the wilderness, God sent food to satisfy His people. In the days of Jesus God again acted by sending His Son to feed His people not only with bread but also with the truth of His teachings. In the New Testament Jesus declares Himself to be the True Bread from heaven given by the Father, and so the food in the desert – mana - and the bread of the Gospel miracle are both signs of that True Bread. In a section following the account of the miracle of the five loaves and fishes in chapter six of St. John's Gospel, Jesus said, I am the Bread of Life. He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty (verse 35). Your forefathers ate in the desert, yet they died. But there is the bread that comes down from heaven, which a man may eat and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If a man eats of this bread, he will live forever. This is my flesh which I give for the life of the world" (verses 49-51).

The Lord's Prayer found in Matthew, chapter 6, provides us with another phrase that helps our understanding of what this means. ...give us this day our daily bread... The expression "daily bread" should not be understood as merely pertaining to the bread of this very day; the bread that sustains our life; rather: It is the bread for the eternal day of God's Kingdom – what sustains us fir immortal life. It is the living "super essential" Bread – Christ Himself: The Bread of Life.

Immediately following this lesson our Lord teaches His disciples about fasting (v. 16ff). We happen to be entering the period of the Dormition Fast (August 1-14). One of the purposes of the fast, as with other periods of fasting in the church, is to remind us of the words of our Lord who said, [Do not labor] for the [food] which perishes, but for the [food] which endures unto everlasting life which the Son of Man will give to you (John 6:27). And in the words of St. Paul (Romans 14:7): The Kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.

Important to our understanding about the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood as Christians, is that we believe and understand that when a person is united to Christ in receiving Holy Communion, he or she does so acknowledge being united with Christ's teaching. The two are inseparable. Unlike other Christian traditions, in our church, Christ's teaching is not a subjective matter or the subject of one's personal interpretation.

If we read further into the sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel, we hear these words: Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in him. ...as the living Father sent me..., so the one who feeds on me will live because of me" (verses 52-57). It is also recorded that it was precisely at this point that the Gospel records that many of the disciples turned back and no longer followed him. And so our Tradition is not as accommodating to our temporal desires. Its purpose is not to temporarily pacify or satisfy our earthly desires. Surely, you and I ask God for many things... But it can be very liberating for you and I when we discover that being members of God's Kingdom pertains to all that is beyond our personal wants and temporal needs: unlike the liberation of the Israelites from Egypt. Our liberation focuses upon Christ as our Source and Bread of Life.


He, who illumines, renews, and regenerates, forgives and heals, purifies and sanctifies. He is Who saves

and sustains us; all who are repentant sinners, the sick and downtrodden.

The Church is first and foremost the Body of Christ. Its success is not centered or focused on human personalities. Perhaps in the case of the Israelites it was Moses. We just heard in today's epistle another very important lesson regarding the divisions that arose among the faithful and that the Apostle Paul messages about. It involved the various personalities that had become prominent leaders and who obviously had a very successful following. It may have been that they were good speakers, charismatic personalities. But the Apostle reminds them something that we too cannot forget: The message is Christ's, and it is He in whose name we are baptized, and it is He who saves us. *(Excerpts from https://www.stmichaelvannuys.org/ - AntiochianChurch)*

Saints Borys and Hlib. The first saints to be canonized in Kyivan Rus'. The two princes were killed in 1015 by their elder brother, Prince Sviatopolk I, during the succession struggle following the death of their father, Volodymyr the Great. Their older brother, Yaroslav the Wise, thereupon presented his struggle for power with Sviatopolk as a crusade to avenge the fratricide. After he came to power, Yaroslav actively sought the canonization of the princes, which was finally realized ca 1068. Meanwhile the memory of Borys Volodymyrovych and Hlib Volodymyrovych had captured the imagination of the Kyivan Rus' population, in large measure because of accounts of the calmness and resignation with which they had accepted their deaths. An account of their murders, Skazaniie i strast' i pokhvala sviatuiu muchenyku Borysa i Hliba (The Tale and Passion and Glorification of the Holy Martyrs Borys and Hlib), is one of the oldest monuments of Ukrainian literature. The two saints have remained popular figures in Ukrainian religious thought. They are commemorated annually in both the Ukrainian Orthodox church and Ukrainian Catholic church on 6 August (24 July OS). *[This article originally appeared in the Encyclopedia of Ukraine, vol. 2 (1989).]*



THE DORMITION OF SAINT ANNA, MOTHER OF THE MOST HOLY GOD-BEARER JULY 25

We celebrate the Dormition of Anna, the mother of the Theotokos, on July 25th. As the mother of the Theotokos, St. Anna (together with Joachim) held an important role in preparing Mary for her role in Salvation history. They taught their daughter to pray, and to love and serve God. They also instructed their daughter by their example of love, perseverance, and self-sacrifice. St. Anna is the Theotokos' role model for motherhood. St. Anna is from the tribe of Judah and the line of David. She is the spouse of Joachim (a Levitical priest). St. Anna promised to dedicate her child to God, before she conceived (and in her old age too!). What a sign of trust in God. Throughout the day, take the time to tell God you trust in Him. St. Anna spent her last two years close to her daughter at the Temple.

_Miracle of the Pochaiv Icon of the Mother of God against the Invaders (1675) The first took place during

the invasion of the Turks in 1675. The populace of Pochaiv gathered at the monastery in order to weather the attack. Gathered together and facing certain death at the hands of the invaders, they "turned to Mary for protection and help." The Blessed Virgin appeared along with Venerable Job of Pochaiv and a host of angels. Her white mantle spread over the monastery and the arrows of the Turks were deflected. This caused enough confusion among the invaders that they scattered, allowing the Ukrainian military to turn their enemies back. The second notable miracle came during the construction of a large church in Pochaiv in the 1780's. A monk ran into the church demanding that everybody leave. After the approximately two hundred workers had left the church, the roof collapsed. In total, 539 miracles have been recorded in the monastery chronicles. After an investigation, the icon was crowned by Pope Clement in 1773.
