# SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST EPISTLE - 2 CORINTHIANS 6: 16 - 7:1 GOSPEL - LUKE 5: 1 - 11 TONE 8

St. Luke introduces us to the blessed moment when Jesus first began choosing His Disciples. When Jesus was done with teaching the people at the Lake of Gennesaret, he told Peter to let down his net to catch some fish. St. Peter was an experienced fisherman and even though he hadn't caught anything after a whole night of fishing, Peter obeyed in humility. The two boats subsequently filled so greatly with fish that they began to sink. All who witnessed this catch were amazed. Jesus then told Peter, and the brothers James and John (the sons of Zebedee), that they would now "become fishers of men" (5:10), and they immediately left everything and followed Him. St. John Chrysostom writes that the fishermen were called through their profession of fishing, just as the Magi were called through their work of astronomy. This shows that all can be called to Christ through their work and can serve Christ through their work. Christ, however, had greater fishing plans for these fishermen, and they showed their obedience by leaving everything at once and following Him. There is a deeper spiritual meaning to this catch of fish, with the boat being a type of the Church, through which the Apostles would be filled with the faithful. St. Cyril of Alexandria writes that this haul gave the Apostles courage and strength on their evangelizing missions, as they knew that their efforts would bear fruit. Following on from this, he writes that Christ calls all to conversion who "are in the depths of the sea, that is to say, those who live in the surge and waves of worldly things." Just as Jesus involved himself in Peter's everyday concerns about fishing, God calls to each of us in our ordinary everyday lives and asks that we follow Him. Sometimes that call is to a radical vocation and sometimes it is a call to feed God's sheep right where we are, in our families, at our work, in our church and in our communities. The message in Luke's Gospel is not so much one of acceptance of, or recognition of a call, it is one of obedience. A call to discipleship is something that God has both commanded and enabled. You see, the fishing for people continues. God has chosen to work through we human beings, we vessels of clay and because God has chosen to work this way, it is crucial that we be alert to God's call and obedient in response to that call.

Jesus' behavior and actions provide the perfect model for us. He went out among the people, into the street, where they lived, worked, experienced joy and sorrow --- all of the messiness of their lives. (https://www.cathedralatl.org/)

Apostle Peter trusted Jesus Christ and for that he was rewarded with a great shoal of fish. Even more, Lord spoke to him; "Do not be afraid; henceforth you will be catching men." Are you too, willing to listen and trust our Lord Jesus Christ? God chooses ordinary people, like you and me, as his servants, ambassadors and he uses the ordinary circumstances of our daily lives and work situations to draw others into his kingdom. Jesus speaks the same message to us today: we will "catch people" for the kingdom of God if we allow the light of Jesus Christ to shine through us. God wants others to see the light of Christ in us in the way we live, speak, and witness the joy of the gospel. Paul the Apostles says, "But thanks be to God, who in Christ Jesus always leads us in triumph, and through us spreads the fragrance of the knowledge of him everywhere. For we are the aroma of Christ to God among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing" (2 Cor. 2:15). Do you witness to those around you the joy of the gospel and do you pray for your neighbors, co-workers, and relatives that they may come to know the Lord Jesus Christ and grow in the knowledge of his love (https://uocofusa.org/)

# SUNDAY, OCTOBER 1 - POKROV FEAST OF THE PROTECTION OF THE BLESSED MOTHER

Our Ukrainian Catholic Church has a great devotion to Mary, the Theotokos, the Mother of God. Throughout the liturgical year, we celebrate various Marian feasts. One such feast is the Pokrov, the commemoration of Her Heavenly Intercession and Protection. It commemorates an appearance of the Virgin Mary in Constantinople.

To understand the love of Ukrainians for the Madonna of Pokrov, we must go back to the 10th century. At that time, whenever the Byzantine Empire (recall that its capital city was Constantinople) was threatened by the Arabs or Slavs, the Virgin Mary appeared with St. John the Baptist and St. John. The Virgin Mary and these two saints appeared to St. Andrew, called Andrew the "Fool in Christ," in the Church of the Blacherns in Constantinople.

During the apparition, the Blessed Mother went in tears to the altar, placing her own veil that covered her head over the people to protect and save them. "Pokrov" means "the veil" in the literal sense and borrows, from the Hebrew of the Old Testament, seter (veil), the figurative sense of "protection" or "security."


The feast of the Pokrov icon therefore means, in other words, Our Lady of Protection. The icon of Pokrov represents the Mother of God standing in orans (praying position) with her arms raised. This feast, which commemorates her appearance, has been proclaimed the national holiday of Ukraine.





Cover us, O Queen with the mantle of mercy, O Pokrov and defense of men, Pokrov and defense of believers. On this day we celebrate your luminous feast, O Mother of God, we the faithful protected by your coming and, contemplating your venerable icon, with tenderness we say: cover us with your holy protection and deliver us from all evil, praying your Son, Christ our God, to grant our souls salvation."

**Troparion (Tone 4):** Today the faithful celebrate the feast with joy illumined by your coming, O Mother of God. Beholding your pure image we fervently cry to you: "Encompass us beneath the precious veil of your protection; deliver us from every form of evil by entreating Christ, your Son and our God that He may save our souls."
