

## TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST EPISTLE - GALATIANS 2: 16 - 20 GOSPEL - LUKE 16: 19 – 31 TONE 4 WHO IS YOUR LAZARUS?

Today in the Church, we read the famous teaching from St. Luke's Gospel about the beggar Lazarus and the rich man (Lk. 16:19-31). It is a difficult passage for we see a rich man in the torments of hell, begging for relief, pleading that his family be warned of their impending doom. Neither request is granted. It seems harsh and cruel. Where is God's mercy?

We find God's mercy at the beginning of the story. It says Lazarus was laid at the gate of the rich man. God saw this extravagantly wealthy man and said, "I want to save him." God devised a plan, "I'll have poor Lazarus lay at the rich man's gate, so that he sees the poor state of his neighbor daily, so that he can learn to pity a suffering human."

It was no accident that Lazarus was laid at this rich man's gate. God knew that if the rich man could open his heart just a tiny bit, give alms just once – that little gap in his cold heart would create an opening for more of God's love and grace to enter.

God is creative in his salvific ways. He doesn't need much – just the tiniest speck of goodness, the littlest inclination to do something good, and He comes rushing in with His grace, beginning salvation in our hearts.

Every day the poor Lazarus laid near the rich man's front door, wasting away, being harassed by animals, starving to death. And every day the rich man's heart grew colder and further from God. It's as if God said, "If he will just show mercy one time, then I will have something to work with." But the rich man refused. He remained absorbed in himself, his own cares, his luxuries, and he disdained the poor Lazarus at his door.

Even after the rich man's death, there is no change of heart. He does not regret his lack of mercy but begins demanding that Lazarus serve him, bringing him water while he burns in hell. When that doesn't work, he again demands the service of Lazarus, that he be sent to warn the rich man's family.

Even in hell, the rich man views himself as superior to Lazarus. His heart has not changed in torments, he simply longs for his old luxuries and comfort. And, I must add, when we view others as lower than us, we are in an upside down, hellish state like the rich man.

Who or what is the Lazarus that God has sent into your life? What people, situations, or circumstances have been sent to get me out of my own head, to get me to pay attention to the needs of others? Who rubs me the "wrong" way in order to get me to see that I am the one who is wrong, that I am living upside down with my head in hell?

God is creatively working out the salvation of each one of us, putting all the pieces in place, masterfully orchestrating the whole thing. But am I paying attention? Do I see my brother Lazarus in my life,

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 26, 2023 - FEAST OF ST. DEMETRIUS - MARTYR

A martyr is not one who chooses to die; rather, it is when one involuntarily - but without hesitation - suffers torment at the hands of others because of a public declaration or

confession of faith, that they genuinely receive the crown of martyrdom. The term martyr actually comes from a Greek word meaning "witness."

One of the most notable of these Martyr saints, the Holy Great Martyr Demetrios the Myrrh-streamer, is honored on October 26.

Born in the 3rd century in Thessalonica, Demetrios was the only son of distinguished and pious parents. Following in his father's footsteps, he joined the military and because of his many virtues was appointed commander of the Roman forces in Thessaly and Proconsul for Hellas.

When the Emperor Maximian, however, began persecuting Christians, the Saint openly acknowledged his Christian Faith and courageously confessed his love for Christ. For this, he was thrown into prison but not before Demetrios distributed all of his goods to the poor through his servant Lupus.

In continuous prayer, St. Demetrios was initially saved from death, helping many non-believers embrace Christianity. Gregory Palamas describes how Demetrios "struggled with evil to the point of shedding his last drop of blood;" beheaded c. 306, Demetrios appears to this day both in dreams and openly to those who invoke his holy name.

As one of the greatest martyrs in all of Christendom, today we continue the more than 1,700-year-old tradition of celebrating St. Demetrios, who by the shining example of his life, gives hope to all those in afflictions and difficulties, such as those courageous Christians in Egypt, Syria and Pakistan who under difficult - and deadly - circumstances continue to confess their faith in Christ.

As St. Gregory (a fellow Thessalonian) wrote about the Great Martyr, may we be "deemed worthy of his intercessions to God, and of the eternal celebrations of the citizens of heaven."

#### St. Demetrius, Patron of Thessalonik and the Military, we sing:

**Troparion, Tone 3**: Verily, the inhabited world found thee a great help in tribulations and a vanquisher of nations, O fight-bearing one. Wherefore, as thou didst demolish the arrogance of Lahosh, and on the battle-field didst hearten Nestor, beseech, O Saint, Christ God to grant us the Great Mercy. Protect those who serve in battle!
