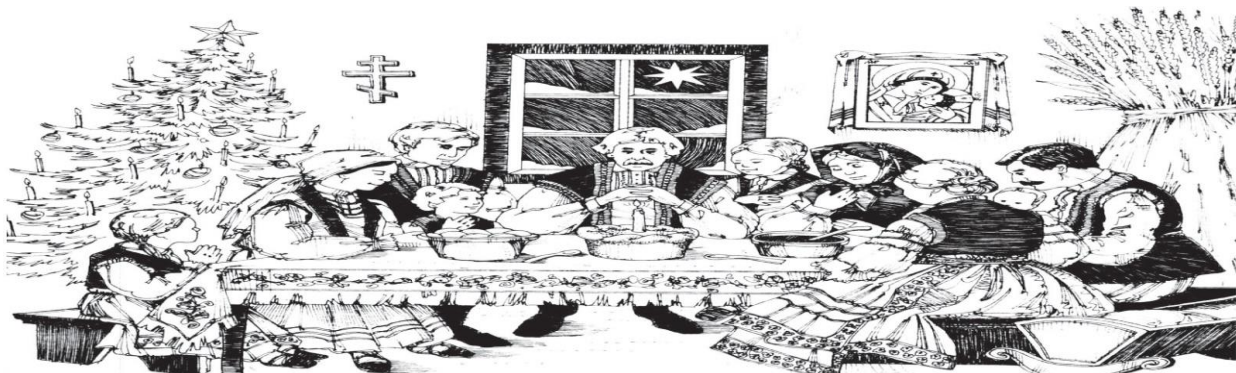

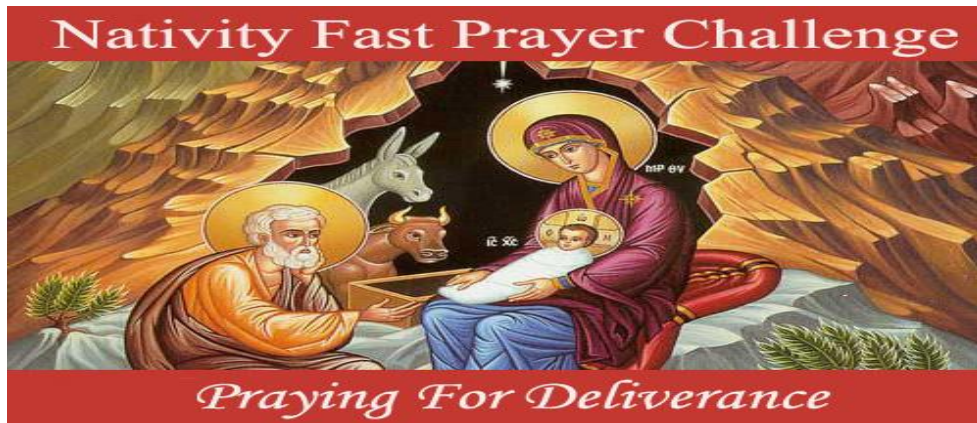

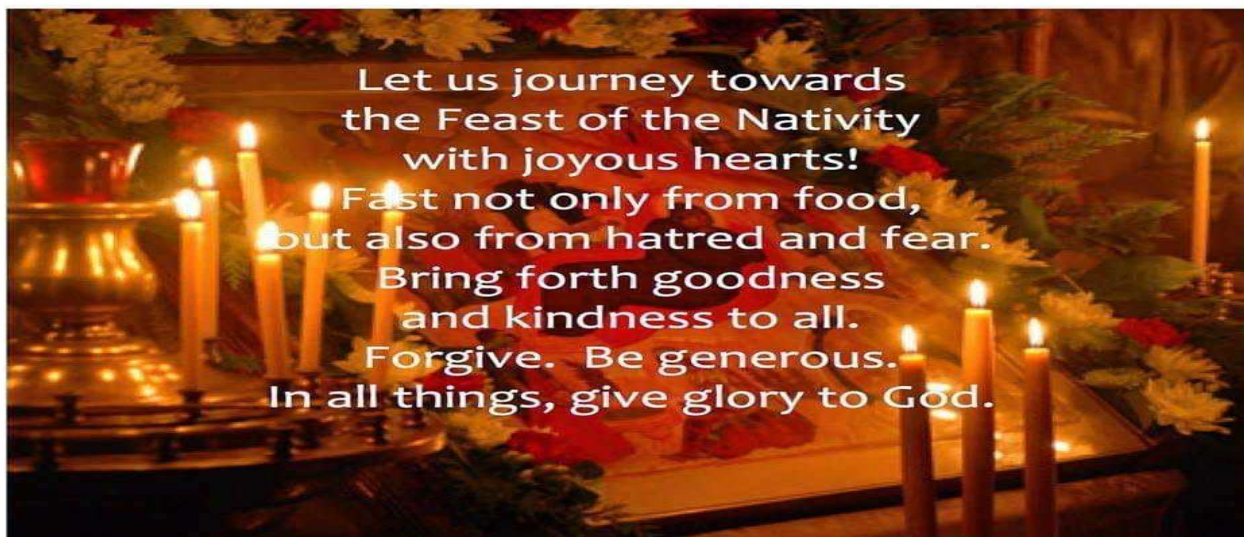

Week 6: Sunday of the Holy Fathers

1. Read the material on this Week's Feast (see below) slowly and meditatively to yourself. Recall that we remember the Holy Prophets and Prophetesses as they spoke God's Word in the world and prophesied the coming of the Messiah.
2. Read and reflect on the following Bible passages Story of the Call of David: I Samuel 16:1-13, noting what kind of person does God chose, and 3 of the Prophecies of the Messiah's Birth (from Royal Hours for Nativity: Micah 5:2-4; Isaiah 7:10-14; Isaiah 9:6-7.) (see below)
3. Pray/sing the Tropar and Kondak of the Week (see below) with your family.
4. Read the material on the Feast aloud, slowly and meditatively with your family.
5. Discuss with your family who God chooses and the Prophecies about Christ.
6. Ask your family the following questions:
 - Does God like better those who are biggest, strongest?
 - How did Samuel show David was chosen King?
 - In Greek and Hebrew, what is that word for "chosen King?"
 - What happens at Baptisms?
 - In the Micah reading: Was a big city chosen? How will people live?
 - In Isaiah 7: What is the Sign? What does Immanuel mean?
 - In Isaiah 9: What will save the World? How will He rule and over what?
8. Conclude with the antiphon of St. Philip's Fast.

Antiphon of St. Philip's Fast: O Bethlehem, be prepared; Eden is opened to all; O Ephratha, be made ready; for in the cave the tree of life has blossomed forth from the Virgin; for her womb has been shown to be a spiritual paradise, in which is the divine plant, from which having eaten, we will live and not die as Adam did. Christ is born to raise the image that had fallen.

Tropar - Tone 2: Great are the achievements of faith! In the fountain of flames, the Three Holy Youths rejoiced as by the water of rest, and the prophet Daniel was revealed shepherding lions like sheep. Through their intercession, O Christ God, save our souls!

Kondak – Tone 2 Armed by the Being that defies description, You defied the man-made idol, O thrice blesses youth. In the midst of the unbearable flames you stood and cried out to God: "In Your mercy o gracious One, hasten and come to our aid," for You can do whatever You will.

Sunday of the Holy Fathers: The Sunday before the Nativity of the Lord is known as the Sunday of the Holy Fathers. On this day, the Church commemorates all those who were well pleasing to God from all ages — from Adam to St. Joseph the Betrothed of the Most Holy Theotokos. The holy prophets and prophetesses are also remembered today, especially the Prophet Daniel and the three holy youths.

Micah 5:2-4: Bethlehem Ephrath, you are one of the smallest towns in the nation of Judah.

But the LORD will choose one of your people to rule the nation - someone whose family goes back to ancient times. The LORD will abandon Israel only until this ruler is born, and the rest of his family returns to Israel. Like a shepherd taking care of his sheep, this ruler will lead and care for his people by the power and glorious name of the LORD his God. His people will live securely, and the whole earth will know his true greatness,
Isaiah 7:10-14

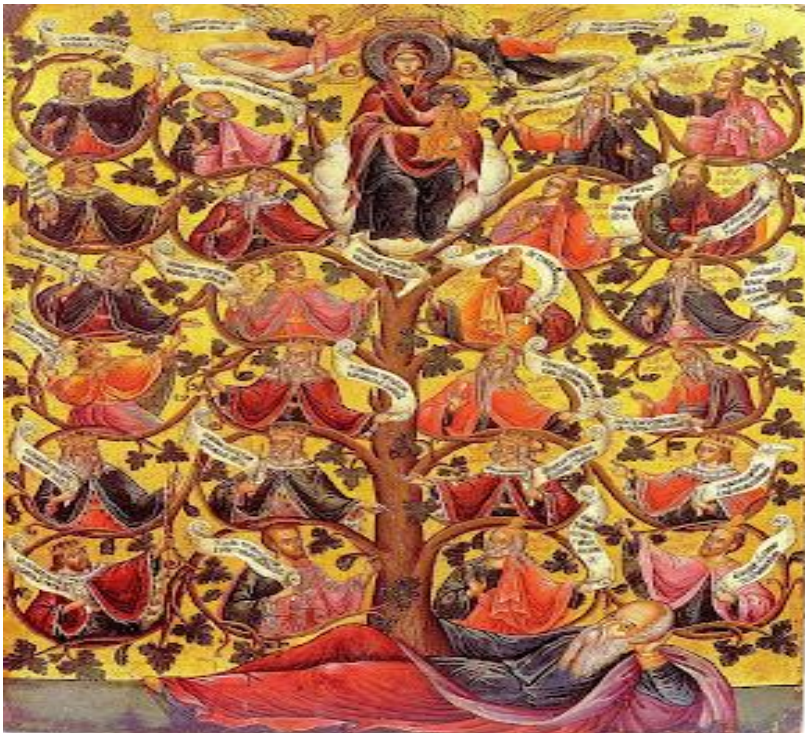
Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz, "Ask the LORD your God for a sign, whether in the deepest depths or in the highest heights." But Ahaz said, "I will not ask; I will not put the LORD to the test." Then Isaiah said, "Hear now, you house of David! Is it not enough to try the patience of men? Will you try the patience of my God also? Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son and will call him Immanuel.

Isaiah 9:6-7

A child has been born for us. We have been given a son who will be our ruler. His names will be Wonderful Advisor and Mighty God, Eternal Father and Prince of Peace. His power will never end; peace will last forever. He will rule David's kingdom and make it grow strong. He will always rule with honesty and justice. The LORD All-Powerful will make certain that all of this is done.

SUNDAY OF THE HOLY FATHERS SUNDAY BEFORE THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD
EPISTLE - HEBREWS 11: 9 - 10; 17- 23; 32 -40 GOSPEL - MATTHEW 1: 1 – 25 TONE 3

The Jesse Tree



On the Sunday before Christmas, we encounter in the Traditional Scripture readings of the Church a cast of literally hundreds of women and men who were faithful to God's promises as recorded in the history of the Old Testament. We read the genealogy of Christ in Matthew's Gospel about some of those people of the Old Testament who were part of God's preparation for the incarnation. Entire generations of people preparing the way for the Lord, led by a few very faithful men and women. In the Epistle from Hebrews (Hebrews 11:9-10, 17-23, 32-40) we hear a few more details from the lives of some of those same people who were faithful to God no matter that they suffered for the faithfulness and no matter that they didn't receive the fulfillment of what God promised. They remained faithful to God's promise and trusted that God would fulfill what had been prophesied or promised.




Really for us to prepare for Christmas we should be reading the scriptures year-round to know what God promised, what people suffered for these promises and because of them. We would learn about our spiritual ancestors in the faith who struggled for several thousand years before the coming of Jesus and since the time of his death. We would learn how hard a struggle it was for the people to be faithful, and how long the sojourn. Matthew's genealogy and the Epistle from Hebrews include people who are farmers and shepherds, businesspeople and slaves, carpenters and soldiers, generals and kings, wise and foolish, musicians and poets, rich and poor, apostles and apostates, faithful and faithless, adulterers and prostitutes, sinners and saints, murderers and law abiding citizens. If we remember all these people and their successes and failures, we can learn from them about how we are to behave. This unlikely cast of characters in our Savior's family tree is a sign that God's promises are not only for righteous Jewish men, but for everyone with faith, including Gentiles, repentant sinners, and those of shockingly low standing in society. Matthew prepares us in his genealogy for the unique kind of Messiah we encounter in Jesus Christ: not one who rewards the proud, powerful, and respectable, but one who blesses the humble, the meek, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, and those with purity of heart who will see God. Immediately following the genealogy, Matthew tells us of the Lord's birth under circumstances even more shocking than those we have described so far. We have heard the story so many times that we may have forgotten how shocking, how embarrassing, how unconventional

the circumstances of Christ's conception were. Surely, many people judged Mary and Joseph and never believed in the miracle of the virgin birth. Surely, it was difficult for Mary and Joseph to change the course of their lives, and to risk their reputations and physical safety, in order to play their unique roles in the unfolding of our salvation. In these last days before Christmas, we should make a concerted effort to accept that the Mystery of our salvation in Jesus Christ is not an extension of our personal accomplishments, good characteristics, or abilities. It is not a reward for good behavior, which is good news because we have all fallen short of holiness in one way or another. Instead, the good news of this season lies in the fulfillment of God's promises to Abraham, now extended to all who have faith in the true Messiah, the One who is anointed to bring light and life to the world, to be the second Adam in Whom our fallen, corrupt humanity is healed and brought into the very life of the Holy Trinity. When we look at the Lord's genealogy, we see people a lot like us. For His people are not self-righteous snobs who never did anything wrong. They are not those who have no problems, struggles, and pains. They are not those who think that everything boils down to money, power, reputation, and getting their own way. They are not those who believe that salvation comes through armies, nations, and political leaders. Instead, they are those who fall before Christ with faith, humility, and repentance, and who know that the only hope for blessing, peace, and fulfillment in their lives is in His mercy. In the coming days, let us prepare to celebrate the fulfillment of the Promise made to Abraham in our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ. For He comes to make us members of His family, to share His eternal life with us; and He will, if only we will believe, repent, and seek first His Kingdom.
