

PENTECOST SUNDAY

EPISTLE - ACTS 2: 1 - 11 GOSPEL - JOHN 7: 37—52, 8: 12 TONE OF THE FEAST

PLEASE NOTE: THERE IS NO FASTING THIS WEEK!

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the scripture has said, 'Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water."



The Lord's teaching comes full circle at Pentecost. He taught in the beginning that the kingdom of heaven is within and now, at Pentecost, he shows us what that means. "Out of your bellies shall flow rivers of living water," speaking of a unity so complete that his very life becomes ours. We become sources of life-giving, eternal water. "Greater works than I have done, you will do," Christ declares. So, now, the truth is known. The wind of the Spirit blows freely through us, around us and in us. What is essential now is our awakening to this truth and our practice of this truth. In this respect, St. Paul tells us what being aware looks like.

He writes, "Put on compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience." To put on compassion, we must practice compassion. To

put on kindness, we must practice kindness. To put on gentleness and patience, we must practice gentleness and patience. We can, if we will, nurture in ourselves the qualities of God. We can develop within ourselves more loving kindness, more peace, more humility, more patience by setting aside just a few moments each day to meditate on these beautiful divine qualities. The more we do, the more we will grow in them – the stronger they will become within us. And then we must practice and practice and practice, choosing to be selfless and beautiful in all that we do. This is what it means to "put on Christ."

If we want to live lives filled with the Spirit of God, we must live lives centered on the Spirit. This is the meaning of synergy. "We are," St. Paul writes, "co-workers with Christ." "We must work out our salvation with fear and trembling," he adds. It does not just happen! We must deliberately and consciously and continuously choose this way of life. We must let go, turn within, bring the light of love into the depths of our own darkness, so that we become illumined from within and then what we do, say and think will increasingly become illuminating.

Remember, there are no enlightened people, there are only enlightened actions.

Jesus is

God in physical form, the one who is the perfect image of God and of what it means to be human. He shows us in form what and who God is. This is the exterior Christ. You might think that would be enough, but no. He told his apostles that it was better that he go away so that he could send the Holy Spirit. This is in keeping with his great humility. He came into the world in utter humility and he leaves it in the same way, making way for the age of the Spirit inaugurated in the theophany of Pentecost.

Holy Spirit has no form and for this reason it is impossible to make an icon of him. The wind, fire, smoke and even the "*likeness of a dove*" are manifestations, symbols and metaphors of his presence, not images of his person. Jesus said, "A spirit has not form as you see that I have." The only possible icon of the Holy Spirit is a saint…is us. (Excerpts from https://www.stmaryorthodoxchurch.org/)

Pentecost is the Spirit directing the apostles, the Theotokos, and other disciples outward into When they had asked about the kingdom coming, they had been told to stay in Jerusalem until the Spirit came upon them, for that is what would direct them into worldwide mission ("You will be my witnesses"). At the feast of Weeks or Pentecost Jews and seekers from the whole missionRoman world and beyond came to Jerusalem to worship - it was one of three great pilgrim feasts. The disciples did not realize it, but this was God's timing.

Suddenly the Spirit rushes upon them, like a wind, like fire, and their hearts burst with languages unknown to them - they poured out of the house into the street and there moving up towards the Temple were all of these Jews from around the Roman world.

Those pilgrims to Jerusalem, devout people, heard and recognized the languages - the praise of God in their own language. That made them attentive when Peter spoke to them in Greek (perhaps through a translator) and shared about Jesus as king, as Messiah. 3000 were converted and baptized.

From that moment the Spirit was thrusting them outward into those lands from which the pilgrims came, sometimes through direction and sometimes through persecution. The Messiah must gather the nations, but the gathering started when the Spirit started it. (https://sermons.logos.com/)

MONDAY, MAY 29 - FEAST OF THE HOLY TRINITY

Two icons share importance for the Feast—the traditional depiction of the Descent of the Holy Spirit with the Theotokos and the Apostles gathered together. The second Icon is that of the Hospitality of Abraham, the three holy angelic figures who appeared to Abraham in the Old Testament. They are symbolic of the Holy Trinity - Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit. We honor the third Divine Person of the Most Blessed Trinity, the Holy Spirit, Who is a Spirit of Love and Truth. He is God Eternal, one in being with the Father and the Son. He is consubstantial. Here as at the Theophany, the Baptism of the Lord in the River

Jordan, God reveals Himself as the Triune God, one God in Three Divine Persons.

Stewardship Prayer


- My church is composed of people like me.
